Nearly One-Fourth of Adults Requesting ADHD Treatment May Be Faking Symptoms

A new survey suggests that almost 25 percent of adults who seek medical treatment for attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) are exaggerating or faking symptoms, to get their hands on stimulant medication such as Ritalin or Adderall. Some students want access to ADHD medication to help their concentration and focus, while others use it to get high.
