THEORY CORNER: Transference Variants - Part 3

TRANSFERENCES OF DEFENSE

Opposed to *transferences of impulse*; defense against impulses finds its way into the transference rather than the impulses themselves. In this form of transference, attention shifts from drives to the

ego's defensive functioning so that transference is no longer merely repetition of instinctual cathexes but includes aspects of ego functioning as well.
