WEBINAR DESCRIPTION:

This course continues to explore human maturation and development in the first two years of life. It concentrates on the importance of child's early experiences, particularly on the dyad mother- infant relationships, including the role of the father, developmental neuroscience, attachment theory and research and the child's personality development. It concentrates on early development of relationships.

WEBINAR OBJECTIVES

1. Identify and discuss the main human maturation and development theories from the psychoanalytic perspective.
2. Describe how caretakers may experience infant's development, especially the dyad mother-infant.
3. Assess human development in terms of the infant's maturation process, including the neuroscience approach.
4. Recognize those infant-parent behaviors that are repeated in the therapeutic setting, considering the attachment theory.
5. Provide opportunities for developing awareness on what contributes to a healthy development and explore challenges encountered.

Dr. Cristiane Irey is a Clinical Psychologist and a Certified Psychoanalyst. Her Master's Degree is in Developmental Psychology. She has been working with patients and teaching for more than 20 years.
